“The End of Multiculturalism - Intercultural Theology Now!”

Amid the diversity of cultures resulting from glocalization, intercultural theology seeks to find new meaning in theological perspectives. In this regard, intercultural theology challenges a traditional way of doing theology. We will explore what intercultural theology refers to and how intercultural theology embraces the shifting formation of multiculturalism in different contexts. Since we focus on Germany, we will deal with issues related to migration, diaspora, and racism as examples of application.
