„Gender Unboxed: Exegetical and Ethical Explorations in German(speaking) Theological Context”

Gender issues are at stake. Gender as a socio-historical as well as material-cultural category has a quite formative significance for the individual, but is also constantly renegotiated in the context of political, legal, and ecclesiastical debates. Especially in the latter area, one encounters specifically theological as well as biblical arguments. But what exactly lies behind these arguments? In this class, a Catholic moral theologian and a Protestant biblical scholar shall address this relationship of gender - ethics - exegesis in a dialogue. We shall draw from insights teaching courses together within a deliberately confessional-cooperative setting at JGU („1+1>2 Theologie Konfessionell-Kooperativ“). The aim is to reveal gender images, relations and conflicts with the help of insights from theological ethics and biblical exegesis and to bring them into conversation with one another.
