 - -Credits awarded for a module if the final module exam or all module part-exams are passed





2. Structure: 1st Semester (Teaching of Tutorial)

- Part of the Research & Teaching Module
- Registration is not made through JOGU-StINe but through chairs
- Chairs will offer Tutor jobs
- Application directly at chairs
- Contract between Chair and Tutor must be signed
- Grade will be made through a visit by chair



2. Structure: 2nd and 3rd semester

- 48 LP by 4 advanced modules
- 12 LP by research module (2 seminars; topics, application process and timelines announced by chairs)
- A lot of different modules to choose from
- Choosing International Economics (IE) or Public Policy (PP) as field of specialization



2. Structure: 2nd and 3rd semester

- Choosing International Economics (IE) or Public Policy (PP) as field of specialization
- 36 LP (24 LP lectures +12 LP seminar) in IE modules OR PP modules
- Maximum of 24 LP in non economic modules (with a maximum of 12 in math modules)

- Focusing on International Economics:
 - Advanced International Economics (Module 4)
 - Financial Economics (Module 5)
 - Empirical Economics (Module 8)
 - Statistic and Econometrics (Module 9)
- Focusing on Public Policy:
 - Advanced Public Policy (Module 6)
 - Macroeconomics and Labour (Module 7)
 - Empirical Economics (Module 8)
 - Statistic and Econometrics (Module 9)



Module 9: Advanced International Economics/Public Policy: Statistics and Econometrics 12 ECTS Duration 1 or 2 semester

Statistics and Econometrics I: Statistical Methods and Econometric Applications

6 ECTS Lecture and Tutorials 1 written exam or term paper and presentation mandatory, each summer

Statistics and Econometrics II: Advanced Econometrics

6 ECTS Lecture and colloquium 1 written exam or term paper and presentation elective, each winter

Topics in Statistic and Econometrics 6 ECTS Lecture and Tutorials 1 written exam or term paper and presentation elective, winter or summer



2. Structure: 4th semester

- Consists of Master Thesis (25 LP) and Colloquium (5 LP)
- at least 60 LP needed for application
- 4 months
- Registration at the Exam office

2. Structure: Going Abroad

- If you want to study abroad for one semester, we suggest to go abroad in your 3rd semester (winter term 2012/13)

3. Exams

- A module exam may consist of:
 - one exam for all courses of a module ("Modulabschlussprüfung" or "Final module exam")

or of

- separate exams for each of the courses of a module ("Modulteilprüfungen" or "Module part-exams")
 → part-exams of a module can be undertaken in different semesters
- See Appendix of the examination regulations



3. Exams

- Written exams (60 120 min)
 Electronic, mid-term and multiple choice
 - exams possible
- Oral exams (15 30 min)
- Term paper (4 6 weeks)



3. Exams

- Exams can be repeated twice
- No free trial for exams
- You cannot retake an exam to get a better grade or more credits
- Failed exams should be retaken as soon as possible
