He was one of the most important critics of Kantian deontology and developed a plausible moral system of his own grounded in compassion. They address topics including: the moral status of animals; the moral permissibility of suicide; the possibility of altruistic action; the nature of virtue and asceticism; how Schopenhauer integrated Western influences with various Indian traditions of moral thinking.
